


Welcome Booklet

Information about our home and childminding services

Our home is a historic 4-bedroom thatched cottage, situated on Oakham Road in Dudley, West Midlands. This unique property features a large driveway where parents and carers can safely drop off and collect their children, with a front garden beautifully enclosed by flowers and plants. Upon arrival, you will notice the sign for 'The Flower Cottage.'

On entering the premises, you will head into the additional annex located on the left-hand side of the cottage. The Flower Cottage Childminding operates within a spacious open-plan room and kitchen area, which leads into a conservatory playroom and extends into our extensive garden spaces. Our facility offers a variety of climbing and physical equipment, leading to a sand shed and a muddy kitchen with an investigative water station for exploration. Children also have access to a planting and potting greenhouse and our own forestry play space. Additionally, they can enjoy our role-play and sensory cabin.

We provide both indoor and outdoor bathrooms, along with nappy changing facilities throughout the setting. Our play spaces for children are separate from our family home to ensure that our childminding services run smoothly and effectively from 8 AM to 6 PM without disturbing neighbours or intruding on our family's privacy regarding their own work schedules.

Our free-flow environment, which is risk assessed daily, operates safely. All necessary health and safety measures have been implemented to ensure that our indoor and outdoor areas are suitable for children. All activities, setups, opportunities, and experiences are tailored to the individual interests of each child. As Early Years Educators, we build on these interests to create awe and wonder for our children, extend their learning, and encourage them to reach their full potential.



A little bit about me and the services I provide...

My name is Caitlin, and I have been dedicated to the Early Years and Child Care sector since I was 16 years old. Throughout my school years, I studied childhood development and went on to complete my Level 3 CACHE Early Years Educator certificate full-time at college. Balancing work and studies, I successfully graduated with Level 4 Advanced Practitioner Status. I then had the opportunity to participate in the Erasmus project, which allowed me to live, teach, and study in Barcelona for five weeks.

With around six years of experience in nurseries, I worked my way up to the role of deputy manager before venturing out to open my own successful business. I am OFSTED registered and based in Dudley, West Midlands. My mum, Joanne, assists me and supports the setting on our busy days.

I have always been passionate about working with children in their early years, believing that these formative years are crucial. From birth, children have an incredible capacity to absorb information, and it is essential to guide, support, and teach them the necessary skills to become independent and aware of the world around them. Providing children with the foundation for future learning, health, and life success has always been my priority.

Transforming my living space into a suitable environment for child care took approximately five months, from December to May. During this time, I completed numerous courses and CPD, gathered all necessary legal documents, and awaited the call from OFSTED. Since then, our home and large outdoor environment, including the outdoor lodge, have undergone continuous improvements to benefit the children's development.

Providing a home-from-home experience and tailoring my working day to the children's needs and development is my top priority. It is a magical experience, and I wouldn't change it for the world. I am delighted to announce that in September 2024, we had our first OFSTED inspection and were graded outstanding!



Everything you need to know...



Opening hours:

The Flower Cottage is open from 8AM – 6PM Monday to Friday, full time. Hours outside of this may also be accommodated due to emergencies or parents/carers working late.

We are CLOSED on bank holidays and my holiday schedule is sent out to parents/carers individually VIA their preferred communication method.

Hourly rate: £6.00 *Minimum of 4 hours*
Daily rate (Includes all meals, trips, and wipes/cream): £55.00 (8AM-6PM)
Overnight stay: Fixed cost at £75 (6PM-8AM) Mon-Thurs *Must be booked in advance* 2 weeks' notice is required. Breakfast is included.
AM Session per day: £24.00 (8:00AM-12:00AM) PM Session per day: £33.00 (12:30PM-6PM)
Meal/snacks- (These costs apply if your child attends using the Hourly rate/AM or PM session) Breakfast - £1.50 AM snack – 50p Dinner - £2.50 Pudding - £1.00 PM snack – 50p Tea - £2.00 Evening snack – 50p Total for all £8.50
Additional Care Package option available Please see page 6. A letter regarding this will also be sent individually to parents/carers.

Help with childcare costs:

You may be able to get financial help and practical help with childcare through a range of options including tax free childcare, universal credit and funding entitlements. You must inform me of your eligibility along with your code. I will always check in with you regarding eligibility, to ensure you claim your entitlement in alignment with my availability. However, it is your responsibility to ensure you apply and renew your funding codes on time.

Please note - childcare vouchers are no longer accepted unfortunately.

Age ranges:

At The Flower Cottage we cater for children within the Early Years aged from 9 months to 5 years. Me and my mum (Assistant) will look after an absolute maximum of six per day.

Staff:

At The Flower Cottage there is myself (Childminder), My mum (Joanne) who is also my assistant and my partner (Joe) is also registered as an assistant too. My stepdad also helps with maintenance and the smooth running of our environment. All have up-to-date DBS checks.

A Commitment to Every Family

Early Education Funding – Options for Parents / Carers

At The Flower Cottage, we prioritise addressing every family's unique needs by offering a variety of options to cater to everyone. Transparency is key for us; therefore, we ensure you know exactly what you are paying for. We do not charge top-up fees, and our invoices are clearly itemised. During the sign-up process, if your child qualifies for any Early Education Funding entitlements, you will be asked to read a separate letter in full and choose from the available options before providing a written signature. For families paying the full amount without funding, please note there has been no increase in fees. The daily rate remains at £55, covering 8 AM to 6 PM, and includes the 'Additional Care Package' at no extra cost.

Terms and Conditions...

Meals	Breakfast, tea, snacks, drinks, and extras are provided in the cost if your child attends using the Daily rate or additional care package. Please see the menu within the welcome booklet to see extra charges for other options – Hourly rate/AM session/PM session/Funded. However, if you do not require hot meals, you have the option to bring a pack lunch for your child.
Deposits	No deposit required.
Child sickness / Holidays	If your child is ill, you will be charged for the session you have booked regardless of attendance. There will be a 50% deduction off your bill if your child is off due to going on holiday, however this must be discussed in advance directly with myself. Two weeks' notice is required to be eligible for the deduction, if absence is taken without discussion, you will be charged your full fees.
Staff absence / Holidays	If I am ill or have a holiday, then there is no charge, and you will be refunded on your next bill if paid in advance. Holidays will be discussed in advance so you can arrange childcare.
Contract	Contracts are to be filled out before your child starts the setting. Contracts can be amended.
Late payment fee	Please be aware that a late payment fee of £10 per day will be applied if childcare fees are not paid by the agreed date. This fee will be added to your invoice. You have a grace period of up to three days to settle the late payment and additional fees. Failure to do so will result in your child not being accepted into the setting until payment is received. If the payment is not made within one full working week, your child's place will be forfeited, and the collection process will commence. The available place will then be advertised.
Late collection fee	You must contact me if you are running late. If there is no contact, a late collection fee of £15.00 will be charged for every 15 minutes - this needs to be paid before your child comes back to the setting.

Terms and Conditions...

Settling in period	<p><u>Paying</u> After signing up, your child will be offered three hours settling in sessions on two days, between Mon-Fri. <u>Free of charge</u>. Any additional settling in arrangements can be made, however you will be charged at the hourly rate.</p> <p><u>Funding</u> If your child qualifies for any of the Early Years Funding Entitlements, we will gradually ease them in with shorter days, extending their session times as they become more comfortable.</p>
Notice periods	<p>A four-week notice period needs to be given if you want to remove your child from the setting, however this can be discussed due to unexpected circumstances.</p> <p>A two weeks' notice period is required to be eligible for a 50% deduction off your bill during your holidays/planned time off.</p>
Permission forms	<p>You are required to complete a range of parental permission forms. These will be discussed with you during show arounds/open day.</p>
Policies and procedures	<p>All of our policies and procedures can be viewed on The Flower Cottage website.</p>
Help with childcare costs	<p>You may be eligible for financial and practical assistance with childcare through various options, including tax-free childcare, universal credit, and funding entitlements. Please inform me of your eligibility status along with your code. I will always check in with you regarding your eligibility to ensure you claim your entitlement in line with my availability.</p> <p>Please remember that it is your responsibility to apply for and renew your funding codes on time. 
Meals and snack time...

Each week, children will enjoy a variety of snack choices delivered in creative and fun ways. They will have the opportunity to create or even grow their own snack plates and participate in activities that encourage making choices and using their imagination to try new foods. These activities include making their own fruit skewers, creating patterns, blending fruits, and making smoothies, among others. During snack time, children will be offered milk or water, and on celebration or themed days, special drinks such as tropical juice, hot chocolate, flavoured drinks, and fruit tea will be introduced. All dishes in this menu provide a balanced and nutritious diet. I have included a variation of hot and cold options, and some of the breakfast and tea meals can be handmade by the children to promote independence and choice-making. Vegetarian options are available, and allergies or dietary requirements will be strictly adhered to. If you prefer to bring a packed lunch for your child, that is absolutely fine.

Whenever the menu is updated, parents and carers will be contacted regarding their children's food interests and new foods they would like their children to try. All suggestions and ideas will be incorporated into the new menu. We also discuss with the children about the foods they like or dislike and new foods they could try. We often take the children to the local supermarket for our weekly food shop, and if we are very busy, we enjoy doing online food shopping together using website photographs. This involvement allows the children to make their own meal and snack choices and to experiment with new textures and tastes.

Allergies and dietary requirements will be strictly adhered to and there will ALWAYS be a vegetarian option available!

All meals served at The Flower Cottage is all prepared and home cooked by myself or my mum (assistant) Jo, including slow cooker and air fried meals too!

Food Menu

Parents/carers will receive an updated menu for the week before on or before Monday morning.


All meals prepared at the setting provide a healthy and balanced diet for all individual children to enjoy. Children are able to explore new tastes and textures with the flexibility of updating the menu every week tailoring towards any food favourites or interests, events and parental input/feedback from the previous week or eating at home. The Flower Cottage ensures to meet the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements for food and drink.

Vegetarian options are always available.

If child does not eat the dinner provided, an alternative option can be offered such as a sandwich with salad.

Snacks:
Children are able to choose from a wide variety of snacks during the AM session, PM session and evening. We celebrate a range of festivals, events and celebrations which enables children to join in with food tasting sessions.
Example of our snack choices are below. (A different variety of snacks are offered to the children every week.)
Fruit, cereal bars, yoghurt, malt loaf, pastries, breadsticks and dips, small portion of sweet selection (Biscuits, chocolate drops, homemade cookies etc). Children also enjoy making their own snacks (and puddings) too!



Lastly and most importantly Communication is KEY!





I communicate effortlessly and effectively with families through WhatsApp on my work mobile. This method has been a game-changer for us and my business, and I am thrilled with the switch! We primarily use messaging and often make phone calls as well. If a child is feeling unwell, has had any issues or unusual behaviour the night before, parents/carers can easily share these occurrences with me. This way, I stay informed about the child's life and can provide the necessary support in partnership with the parents/carers.

As a childminder, I offer a more personal and one-to-one experience in my home environment. I find it essential to have 'catch-ups' rather than formal 'meetings' with families. This friendlier approach allows us to discuss the child's development, next steps, interests, and any enquiries parents/carers may have.

Every day, I send photographs and brief observations to parents/carers individually. Each week, families receive multiple photos of their child, along with a short overview of their activities, topics learned, WOW moments, and small targets/home tasks to encourage further learning outside the setting along with home learning book bags.

Additionally, our families receive a handwritten care diary for their child/ren daily. The diary includes details such as meals/snacks, nappies/toilet intervals, sleep times, brush time, bottles, and any important messages. We have two versions of the care diary, one for babies and one for toddlers. Below, I will include an image of our care diary.
